No one should be denied the gift of sight.

You and so many others share this mission with us. Because of you, we have the privilege to transform the lives of people through corneal

transplantation and crucial eye and vision research. Every accomplishment motivates us to find new ways to expand our reach, connect more effectively with our communities and provide a life full of sight to anyone in need.

In 2018, our work provided sight-restoring cornea transplants to 8,033 people around the world, and 2,735 tissues were donated to advance promising eye and vision research. In addition, Eversight partnered with surgeons in 34 countries and supported five medical missions last year.

Additionally, our eye banking development project in Pakistan is nearing a historic milestone. Three eye banking facilities throughout the country, each with the capability to evaluate, prepare and distribute locally donated corneal tissue, are under construction following Eversight guidelines and protocols.

But our greatest impact comes from relationships with the people in the communities we serve—surgeons, researchers, donor families, cornea recipients and charitable supporters. These connections are the framework of our impactful approach, and our mission to restore sight and prevent blindness is not possible without them.

The Eversight mission began in 1947 with the establishment of one of the first nonprofit eye bank in the United States. Today, our services reach beyond traditional eye banking by recovering, evaluating and providing human eye tissue for transplantation; supporting research into the causes and cures of blinding eye conditions; promoting donation awareness through public and professional education; and providing humanitarian aid to people in the U.S. and around the world in need of sight-restoring therapies.

Eversight is also strengthening its impact around the world by developing partnerships with local governments, healthcare professionals and opinion leaders to bring clinical training and eye banking services to regions like the Middle East, East Asia and South Korea. We have positioned ourselves to directly help millions of people living with blindness and vision impairment.

Looking to the future, our vision is to expand our reach, connect more effectively with communities and provide a life full of sight to anyone in need.

Colton Thompson was fishing with his sister and brothers when the unimaginable happened. A fishing lure accidentally hooked the 7-year-old’s eye, ripping through the middle before embedding itself in his eyelid.

A significant scar formed across Colton’s cornea, blocking his vision as the scar grew in density. Colton loves playing sports with his siblings, but decreasing vision in his left eye made it difficult. His physician decided the only way to save Colton’s sight was a cornea transplant, using donor tissue provided by Eversight.

Today, Colton sees all the important things in life. He’s enjoying school, sports and keeping up with his brothers and sister.

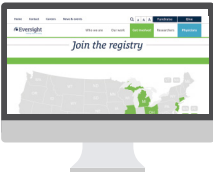
Blinding eye diseases like diabetic retinopathy, glaucoma and macular degeneration have no cure. Your donation supports groundbreaking research to develop new cures and treatments by connecting researchers with donor eye tissue and grant funding.

Globally, an estimated 1.3 billion people live with some form of vision impairment. While corneal transplantation gives sight to many, only 10% of blindness is caused by corneal diseases or injury. There are no cures or effective therapies for many conditions.

But the innovative Eversight Center for Eye and Vision Research is changing the future of sight restoration. Since 1980, Eversight has awarded more than \$4 million to support preliminary research investigating blinding eye diseases, as well as to further advances in corneal surgery and eye banking practices.

James D. Reynolds, Ph.D., was among five recipients who received grants from the Eversight Eye and Vision Grant Program in 2018. The Case Western Reserve University professor is pursuing a novel treatment that could improve the quality of tissue for transplantation and increase the number of corneas available for transplant.

Dr. Reynolds’ grant is part of one of the only eye bank-led programs in the country providing scientists with the innovative resources they need to find new cures and treatments for blinding eye conditions.
